92. What is a sacrament?

A sacrament is a holy ordinance instituted by Christ; wherein, by sensible signs, Christ and the benefits of the new covenant are represented, sealed, and applied to believers.

93. Which are the sacraments of the New Testament?

The sacraments of the New Testament are baptism, and the Lord's Supper.

New Testament Reading: James 4:13-16

Confession of Sin: from Psalm 51:1-4, 9-12, 16-17

Pastor: Have mercy on us, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out our transgressions.

Congregation: Wash us thoroughly from our iniquity, and cleanse us from our sin! For we know our transgressions, and our sin is ever before us.

Against you, you only, have we sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.

Congregation: Hide your face from our sins, and blot out all our iniquities.

Create in us a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within us.

Congregation: Cast us not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from us.

Restore to us the joy of your salvation, and uphold us with a willing spirit.

Congregation: For you will not delight in sacrifice, or we would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering.

All: Our sacrifice, O God, is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

Assurance of Pardon: Romans 8:31-34

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.
